## Asia



### English

Like with reading, we will be using 'The Girl Who Stole an Elephant' to begin our Year 6 writing! Along with this, the children will write a short narrative to create suspense. We will also be using our experiences from Little Canada to write informal letters to friends and family.



### Reading

In our reading lessons, we will be focusing on our skills through a book which the children will be familiar with from Year 5 called: The Girl Who Stole an Elephant by Nizrana Farook. We will also be looking at some of the culture of Asia in non-fiction books.

### Spelling and Phonics

As a school, we follow Read Write Ink for phonics and use the Spelling Shed resources. We will recap the rules for adding the 'ly' suffix, the 'tion, ssion or cian' suffix, the 'ibly/ably' suffix and the 'ent/ant' suffix. We will also be recapping the Year 1 and 2 spelling rules in our 'review' part of each spelling lessons to make sure they are second nature in the high level vocabulary we use in our writing.

### Maths

#### Place Value

We will be exploring numbers up to 1 million. The children will be putting them on a number line, drawing them, making them, writing them in words, comparing them, rounding them, adding 10, 100 and 1,000 them and solving problems using them.

#### Addition/Subtraction

We will be adding numbers with up to 6 digits, using the formal/compact method. We will start by making and drawing it before using the abstract method. We will then solve problems using the methods we have learnt.

#### Multiplication/Division

We will build on the learning that the children did in year 5, using the formal written method for both multiplication and division. They will need to apply these skills to solve reasoning problems.

*We will also be improving our mental maths. To help your child succeed in year 6 maths, times tables will be essential. We will be teaching the children a number of easy games to play and practice this term.*

<p><b>About the Topic!</b></p> <p>What are China, India and Japan like? We start the year off by researching our class country, exploring the key human/physical features, identifying specific tourist sites both natural and man-made.</p> <p>Year 6 begin their journey of independence through an afternoon section called: Rolling Programme, preparing them for secondary school.</p>	<p><b>Art</b></p> <p>Our second week of term will concentrate on art and using our topic focus of Asia for inspiration. 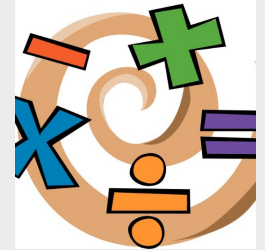
## Handwriting

## Maths

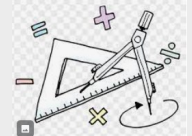
### Basic Operations

We will continue by completing the two final operations. The focus will initially be on the traditional written methods before looking at how to apply reasoning to real-life problems.



### Fractions and Percentages

A large proportion of our year is taken up by fractions, the understanding of which is essential. This will include making fractions and also using fractions with all four operations.



During our percentage learning, we will be converting between fractions and percentages as well as finding percentages of whole numbers and percentage increase / decrease. This will be followed by our reasoning problems with real life contexts (profit, loss, sales, discounts etc). We even go shopping in the Argos catalogue for sale items!

*We will also be improving our mental maths. To help your child succeed in year 6 maths, times tables will be essential. We will be teaching the children a number of easy games to play and practice these throughout the autumn term.*

<p><b>About the Topic!</b></p> <p>We will be focusing on Great Britain since 1066. This will be an opportunity for the children to explore a range of settlement periods over the last 1000 years and come to a conclusion of our enquiry question. It will also be another opportunity for the children to work like historians and weigh up</p>	<p><b>History</b></p> <p>We will be learning all about Britain since 1066. Whether diving into the mysteries of the Medieval Period or dog fights of WW2, the children will be looking at all aspects to life of the different ages and how they have impacted the way we live today.</p>	<p><b>ICT</b></p> <p>Continuing on from our research in history, will be evaluating the reliability of online sources. When working as historians, it is important that the children understand how conclusions are made throughout history and we will be assessing different primary and secondary sources that we can find online.</p>	<p><b>Geography</b></p> <p>We will attempt to understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of human geography of a region of the United Kingdom. This will be done specifically through the study of maps and applying our mapwork skills.</p>	<p><b>D&amp;T</b></p> <p>We will be looking to join textiles using a greater variety of stitches, such as backstitch, whip stitch, blanket stitch.</p> <p>We'll use a full range of materials and components, including textiles and then critically evaluate the quality of design, manufacture and fitness for purpose of products as they design and make them.</p>
