In this hot weather, we don't want children to lose their cool (or anything else)!

We hope, like us, you have been enjoying the lovely weather this week. Although we know it seems very British to complain about the weather regardless of the temperature, we know there are a number of issues that can arise with the rising temperature. As our children use the field more at lunch time, there is an increased risk of tick bites (please check your child at the end of the day) and there's also the possibility of getting grass stains on uniform. Too much sun exposure also poses the problem of potential sunburn. However, we think the blessings definitely outweigh the disadvantages: there is minimal risk of tick bites and grass stains can be eliminated from most clothes with detergent and a hot cycle in the washing machine. Slapping on an, all-day-protection, Factor 50 sunscreen and staying in the shade, further limits the issues that can arise from this weather.

However, there is one further issue you may not have considered. The hotter temperatures cause many children to shed cardigans and jumpers, as they play outside. Many of the children will also choose to wear a hat to protect them from the sun. With some of these items being discarded at the end of a lunchtime, it inevitably means they make their way to a central lost property. With a school of nearly 600 children, it then becomes nearly impossible to return these items to their rightful owners if they're not named. We will always try to get lost items back to the children, if they are named, so please ensure that all jumpers, cardigans, hats and caps are clearly labelled. If you did this with a permanent marker at the beginning of the year, please check again in case it has faded in the wash.

'Into the Deep Blue' themed lunch




